7. Teachers' update - Ashley Frketich

- This has been a closer to normal start and has meant a quicker transition back into school and everyone is settling in well. Thank you for the PAC treats, this really helps morale. Ms. Maddern / Note from the Library: Library is back to weekly lessons/ $30-40 \mathrm{~min}$ storytime followed by book exchange. She also provides reading support for children and teachers.

8. Principal's update - Mr. Hansen

- So far things are going extremely well. Feels really good to be back and looking forward to his second year and being closer to "normal". Other than Ellen John and Val Mucciarelli have been hired, which James is super excited and feeling very lucky about, there are no new teacher changes.
- No staggered Start, no cohort and no hybrid classes unlike last year. It is very exciting for the children to be able to have everyone playing together. Children are still encouraged to give space and there is more access as parents can come in with masks (mandatory), sign in \& drop off at the office - these are big steps from last year.
- Exposures: Last year isolating events, nothing spread. Like last year Island Health contact and information goes to CDC - decides who is called to isolate. The difference for this year is no general notice to schools about exposures.
- Assemblies will happen this year later in the fall with limited size groups: school divided into primary and intermediate for size control. Volunteers are allowed in certain circumstances more generally. In general, the school is starting slow and on the side of caution. There have been about 40-50 emails from parents about covid issues, and he is doing his best to give information and support parents' concerns.
- Parent Teacher via Zoom 6th and 7th early dismissal.
- Projector is installed! Thank you PAC
- PAC to look at logo and create something with First Nations that is more specific to our community and location. Oaklands has a totem at the entrance, perhaps something along these lines or a mural.
- FSA's exams on Oct.4th Sample test available grade 4
- Report Cards 4-5, reduce the use of grades, more positive and detailed way of addressing progress

9. New business and open Q \& A

- Question: After School Play on the playground, can it come back?

Answer: Not at this time. Will revisit later in the year.

- Question: Gate congestion at Fairfield gates

Answer: James will send out a reminder not to congrats right at the gates.

- Question: Concern about the mixed messages, differing levels of comfort, how we all interpret rules
Answer: James will offer more communication. School is following all public health guidelines and it is harder than last year as it was more strict and clear cut last year. He is collaborating with SJD and Willows to find common approaches for the community.
